

John Harper Son to James Harper and Jannet Sues was  
born in Ireland in the County of Derry and Parish of  
Newtownlamivaddy the 10<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1705.  
Came to America in October 1720 With his Father & Mother  
who had at that time five Children Viz. three Sons and two  
Daughters Anne the eldest married to James Millar in Ireland  
Joseph the Eldest Son married to Merron Simpson in Milton  
~~near Boston~~ William Second Son Died unmarried  
Sarah second Daughter married to John Montgomery in  
Hopkinton near Boston

~~At Casco Bay and~~ ~~settled~~ at Casco Bay in New England and settled  
there but the Indians making war two or three years after their  
arrival the whole family Except John moved to Boston John  
served near four years against the Indians afterwards came to  
Boston also Was married by the Rev<sup>d</sup> Sam<sup>l</sup> Barret the 8. Nov<sup>r</sup> 1728  
to Abigail Montgomery Daughter to W<sup>m</sup> Montgomery & Mary  
Aken (in Hopkinton) who came from Killallo in the County of Mayo  
in Ireland & settled at Casco Bay in the year 1719 and was driven  
off by the Indian war as above and settled in Hopkinton in N. England  
where John & Abigail were married

William Harper their Eldest Son was born in Nodules Island  
at Boston in New England 15<sup>th</sup> Sept<sup>r</sup> 1729 and Recorded in the town  
Clerks Office and was baptized by the Rev<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Clark

James Harper 2<sup>d</sup> Son was born in Boston 26 March 1731  
Recorded as above Baptized by the Rev<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Moorhead

Mary Harper was born in Boston 23 June 1733 baptized by M<sup>r</sup>  
Harper 3<sup>d</sup> Son was born in Boston 31 May 1734 baptized  
by the Rev<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Moorhead Marg<sup>t</sup> Harper born in Boston died in  
the 2<sup>d</sup> year of her age

Margaret Harper the 3<sup>d</sup> Was born in Boston 7<sup>th</sup> Feb<sup>r</sup> 1734  
was baptized by the Rev<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Moorhead

Joseph Harper 4<sup>th</sup> Son was born in Middletown in Connecticut  
11<sup>th</sup> Feb<sup>r</sup> 1742 Recorded in the town Clerks Office and  
baptized by the Rev<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Ruffel

Alexander Harper 5<sup>th</sup> Son was born in Middletown  
22 February in the year 1744 Recorded in the town  
Clerks Office & baptized by the Rev. M<sup>r</sup>. Rufel

Abigail Harper was born in Middletown July 1745  
Recorded in the town Clerks Office & baptized by Rev. M<sup>r</sup>. Rufel

Miriam Harper was born in Windsor in Connecticut  
the 14<sup>th</sup> Feb<sup>r</sup> 1750 Baptized by the Rev. M<sup>r</sup>. Edwards

John Harper Removed from Windsor in Connecticut  
to Cherry valley in Albany County New York Colony  
with all his family in October 1754

James Harper 2<sup>d</sup> Son to John and Abigail Harper  
Departed this life by the small pox 22 March 1760  
in the 29 year of his age Interred in the burying yard in  
Cherry valley

Abigail Wife of John Harper the Mother of this family  
Departed this Mortal life at his House at the beaverdam  
Cherry Valley 28 Dec<sup>r</sup> 1767 in the 59<sup>th</sup> year of her age by  
a Consumption & was Interred by her 2<sup>d</sup> Son James on his right  
side in the burying ground in Cherry valley

John Harper the father of this family Departed  
life 20<sup>th</sup> April 1785 at Harpersfield being aged  
Eight Months & 21 Days & was buried by his Children in the  
burying ground at Harpersfield

William Harper  
was Married in Albany 13<sup>th</sup> April 1760 by the Rev. M<sup>r</sup>.  
Ogden and Registered in the Church Book  
Married to Margaret Williams daughter of Edward Williams (Buckler  
in Philadelphia) and Sarah

Margaret 3<sup>d</sup> daughter of this family departed this life  
at Cherry valley 11<sup>th</sup> 23 of August 178
